RESTRICTION OF FLYING REGULATIONS FOR THE VISIT TO THE UNITED KINGDOM BY A HEAD OF STATE 3 - 5 JUNE 2019

- A Head of State is to visit the United Kingdom during the period from 3 to 5 June 2019 inclusive. The visit will include a visit to D-Day 75th anniversary events at Southsea, Hampshire. As part of the overarching security plan, the Secretary of State for Transport has decided it necessary to introduce Restriction of Flying Regulations under Article 239 of the Air Navigation Order 2016.
- The charts in this document relate to the areas defined in the associated text; all areas will be subject to NOTAM action; these are to be read in conjunction with this document. Pilots are strongly encouraged to employ the use of moving map technology and/or an air traffic service to mitigate the risk of inadvertent airspace infringements. This briefing notice should also be read in conjunction with AIC M 057/2019 (RESTRICTION OF FLYING REGULATIONS D-DAY 75TH ANNIVERSARY FLYPAST PORTSMOUTH AND THE ISLE OF WIGHT 5 JUNE 2019) and AIC M 058/2019 (RESTRICTION OF FLYING REGULATIONS D-DAY 75TH ANNIVERSARYPORTSMOUTH, HAMPSHIRE 5 JUNE 2019).

The times mentioned in this Notice are Co-ordinated Universal Time (UTC), which is one hour behind British Summer Time.

CHART 1 - AREA A - BETWEEN LONDON STANSTED AIRPORT AND CENTRAL LONDON


- 3 Subject to paragraph 4 between 0730 hours and 0930 hours on 3 June 2019 no aircraft is to fly below 2,500 FT AMSL within the area displayed on Chart 1 as AREA A and bounded successively by:
 - a) a straight line joining the following points:
 - i. 514508N 0001309E;
 - ii. 514055N 0000652E; and
 - iii. 513232N 0000055W; and
 - b) the anticlockwise arc of a circle having a radius of 17 NM centred on 512812N 0002713W from 513232N 0000055W to 513611N 0000311W; and
 - c) straight lines joining the following points:
 - i. 513611N 0000311W;
 - ii. 513611N 0001830W;
 - iii. 515101N 0000025W;
 - iv. 515146N 0000006W; and
 - v. 515155N 0000120E; and
 - d) the anticlockwise arc of a circle having a radius of radius 8 NM centred on 515306N 0001406E from 515155N 0000120E to 514508N 0001309E.

 - the clockwise arc of a circle having a radius of 17 NM centred on 512812N 0002713W, from 513611N 0000311W to 512013N 0000316W; and
 - c) straight lines joining the following points:
 - i. 512013N 0000316W;
 - ii. 512014N 0001902W; and
 - iii. 513611N 0001830W.
- 6 Paragraph 5 does not apply to any aircraft:
 - a) making an approach to, or departing from:
 - i. London City Airport;
 - ii. London Heathrow Airport; or
 - iii. Royal Air Force Northolt; or
 - iv. London Heliport, Battersea;

whilst under the control of

- i. London Terminal Control Centre at Swanwick;
- ii. Royal Air Force (Unit) Swanwick; or
- iii. the air traffic control units at:
 - (aa) London Heathrow Airport Air Traffic Control;

Subject to paragraph 8, between **0845 hours and 1000 hours on 5 June 2019**, no aircraft is to fly below 2,500 FT AMSL within the area bounded by straight lines joining successively the following points:

- a) 512013N 0003800W;
- b) 512840N 0001850W;
- c) 512014N 0001902W; and
- d) 512013N 0003800W.

8 Paragraph 7 does not apply to any aircraft:

- a) making an approach to, or departing, from:
 - i. London Heathrow Airport whilst under the control of either London Terminal Control at Swanwick, or the air traffic control unit at London Heathrow Airport; or
 - ii. London Heliport whilst under the control of either London Terminal Control at Swanwick, or the air traffic control unit at London Heliport; or

 - iii. 505445N 0010338W; and
 - b) the anticlockwise arc of a circle having a radius of 8 NM centred on 504650N 0010521W from 505445N 0010338W to 504952N 0011702W.
- **13** Paragraph 12 does not apply to any aircraft:
 - a) making an approach to, or departing from, Southampton Airport whilst under the control of the air traffic control unit at Southampton Airport; or
 - b) operated by:
 - i. the National Police Air Service;
 - ii. the Helicopter Emergency Medical Services; or
 - iii. the Maritime and Coastguard Agency; or
 - iv. The Queen's Helicopter Flight; or
 - c) operated with the authority of the Metropolitan Police Service who may be contacted at restrictedairspace@met.police.uk.
- Due to these restrictions of flying regulations, the Bishops Waltham Flying Area is not to be used between 1300 hours and 1415 hours on 5 June 2019. No aircraft is to operate into or out of Lower Upham or Roughay Aerodromes during these times.
